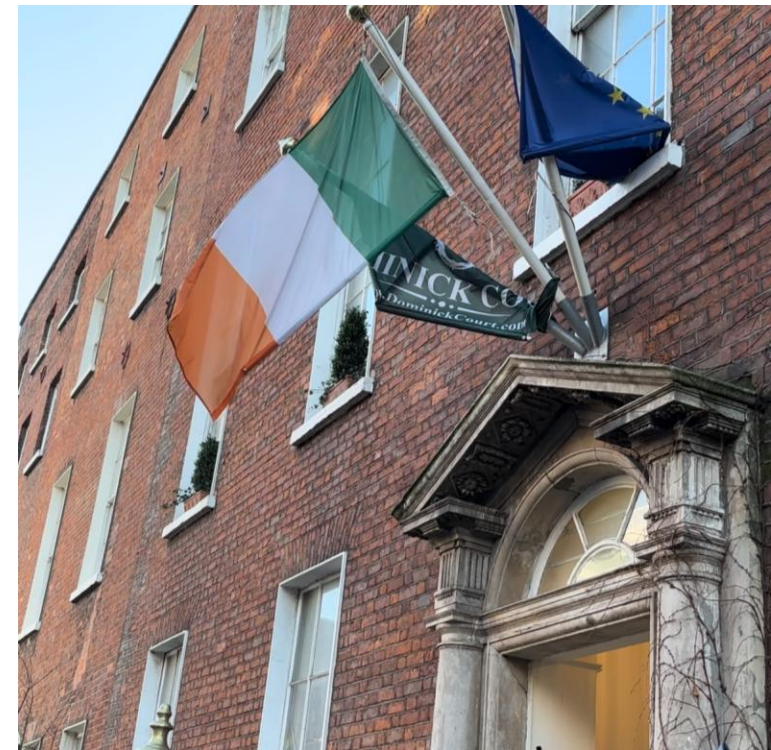
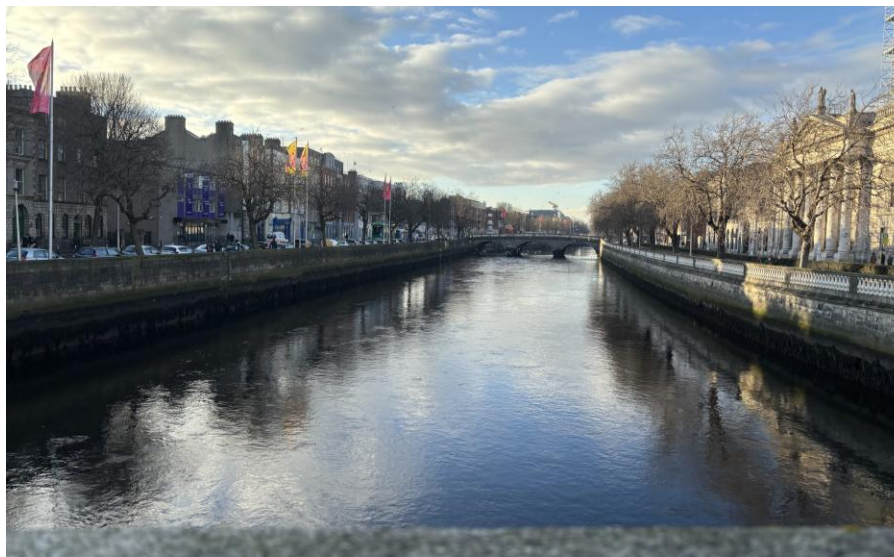
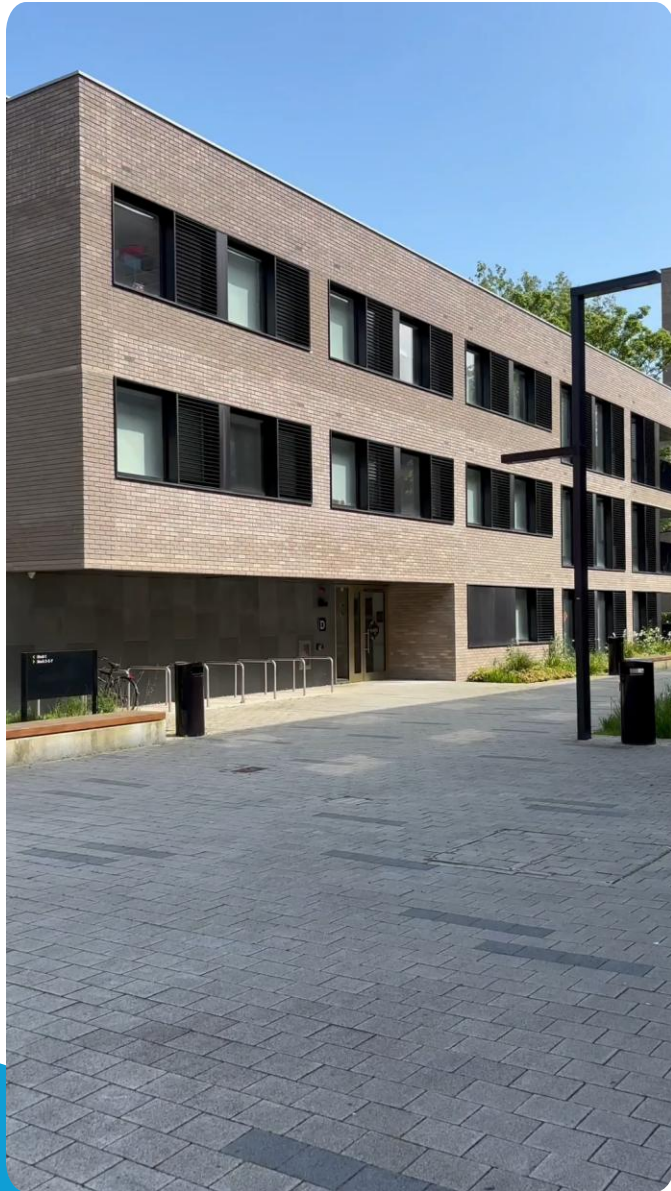


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Housing Situation

- Start looking early!
- Yugo Student accommodation close to Grangegoreman Campus)
- 310 € per week: ca. 6.300€ in total
- One bedroom apartment (12-14.5 m²) with your own bathroom, desk and closet, shared kitchen and shared living room
- Accommodation has everything you need & more: laundry room, study rooms, tv room, communal rooms, gym, outdoor basketball court, rental hoover etc.



Finances

- Ireland is expensive (but accomodation is most expensive aspects)
- I would recommend saving a year in advance
- Erasmus+ helps a lot
(covered about 1/3 of my spendings)
- My spendings were about 600-800€ per month
- In total I spend about 10.500€



TU Dublin

- Main Campuses for me were Grangegoreman and Aungier Street
- Only had a limited amount of classes (most classes were created for Erasmus students)
- Classes were fun and very interesting (also very small)
- Join Student Societies: Disney, Film, Sport etc.
- Organisation can be a bit messy in the beginning
- Traveling between campuses is very easy

- Explore Dublin: very walkable and beautiful corners everywhere
- Dublin has great (free) museums: National Gallery, National History Museum or Hugh Lane Gallery
- The Botanical Garden is always worth a visit

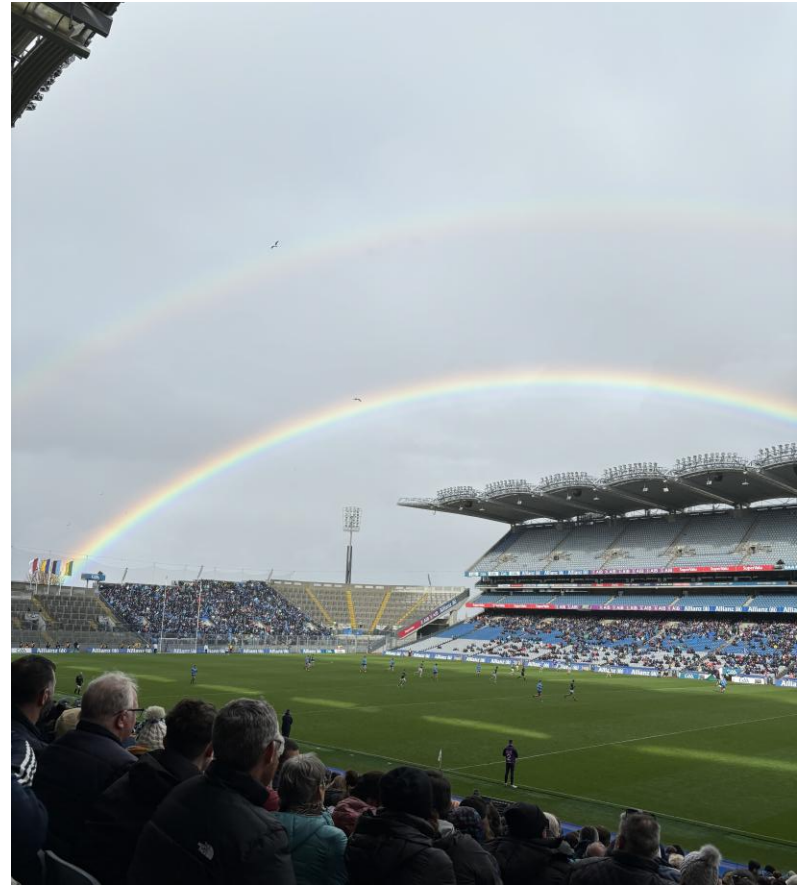

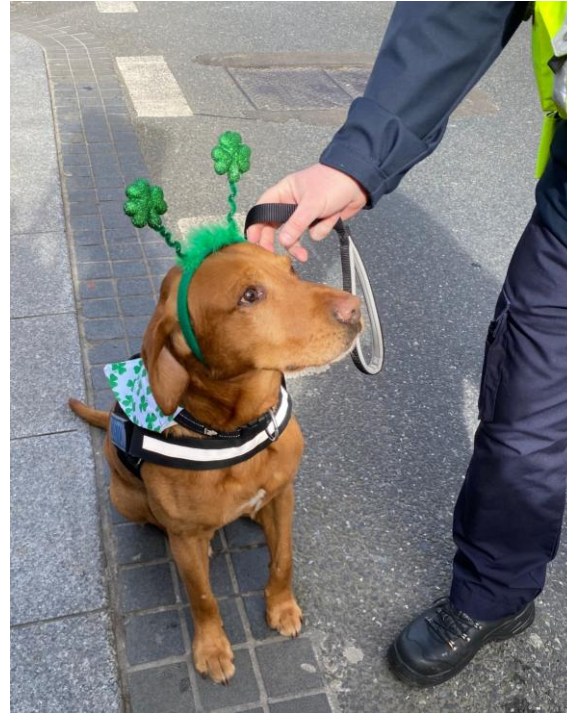

- Take the Train to Belfast and go to the Titanic Museum and do the Game of Thrones and Giant's Causeway Tour

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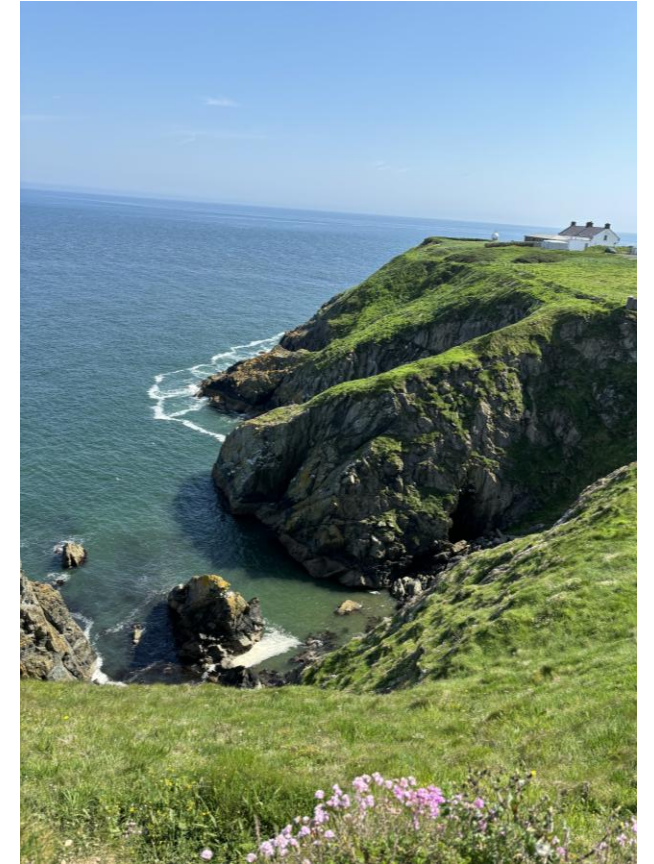

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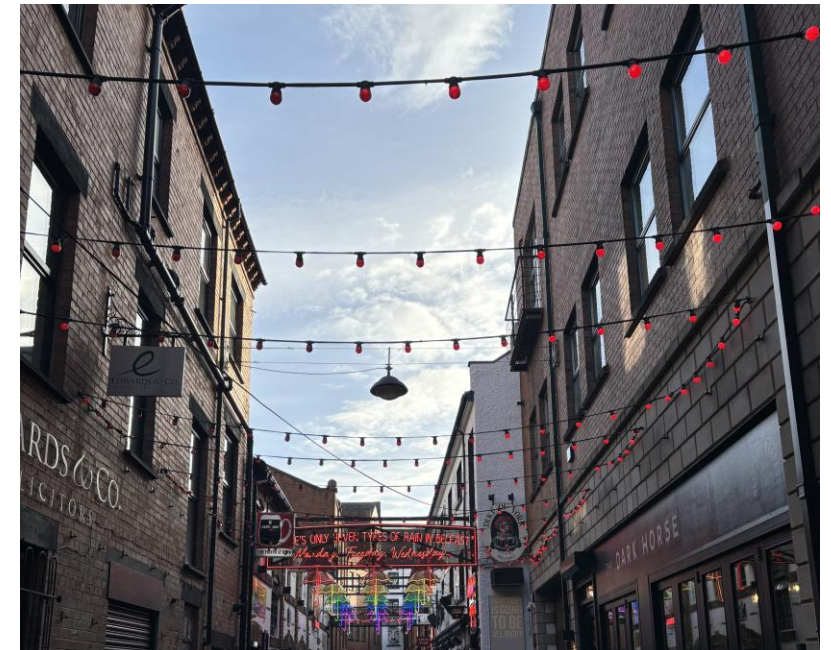
